A <u>Mental Health Treatment Plan</u> entitles a person to a Medicare rebate for up to 10 psychology sessions per calendar year\*. A medical doctor\*\* must review the plan periodically.

### **Initial GP Referral**

Your GP prepares a mental health treatment plan and writes a referral letter. This referral can be used with any psychologist. This referral is usually for 6

Psychology Sessions to begin.

### **Updated referral**

You must see a GP for an updated referral **after the 6**<sup>th</sup> **session** to continue to receive Medicare rebates. This does not need to be the same GP who wrote the initial referral. You will not receive a rebate for any further sessions until the review is completed (you may elect to have sessions without rebate, however).

### **TOTAL Psychology Sessions**

You can claim a total of 10 sessions per calendar year. If your plan rolled over from 2022 to 2023, you may need to see your GP for a 2<sup>nd</sup> review to access up to 10 sessions for the year.

# **6 Psychology Sessions**

At your first psychology session, give the referral letter and plan to your psychologist.

After each session, they can lodge a claim with Medicare for a rebate, to be paid to you, usually between \$89 - \$131

## **4 Psychology Sessions**

Give the review paperwork from your GP to your psychologist. This usually entitles you to 4 more sessions.

- \* Calendar year extends from January 1 to December 31
- \*\* a referring doctor may be a GP, a psychiatrist, or a paediatrician. We refer to a GP throughout this document, as this is the usual referrer.
